Eligibility For NWMAF Empowerment Self-Defense (ESD) Instructor Certification

NWMAF Empowerment Self-Defense Certification is designed to recognize women, trans, and nonbinary instructors with significant and broad knowledge and teaching experience in Empowerment Self-Defense. Certified instructors demonstrate a breadth and depth of understanding of ESD principles and ethical practices. They are highly skilled in teaching awareness, verbal, and physical self-defense skills and can craft safe and welcoming environments for participants of all identities, abilities, and backgrounds.

Benefits of Certification

- Establishing recognized professional credentials to attract students, funding, partnerships, and collaborations
- Joining a network of knowledgeable and experienced ESD Instructors who are leaders in the field

- Sharing skills and building relationships with other ESD instructors
- Accessing documents, curricula, and reflections on teaching philosophy and practice, invaluable aids for program development and instructor training
- Documenting your curricula, policies, and practices

Certification Application Checklist

- Current NWMAF membership. You must be a current member of NWMAF for your application to be accepted. Visit the NWMAF website https://nwmaf.org/join/>for membership information.
- Attend at least one NWMAF annual, regional, or virtual conference, including completing the ESD Model Course and additional ESD sessions for a total of 12 hours.
- In-depth training in ESD
- At least 3 years of consistent ESD teaching
- Completed application questionnaire (see below)
- Supporting documentation (Where noted, links can be found on the Instructor Certification page https://nwmaf.org/resources/empowerment/instructor-certification
 - Written curriculum for short workshop (1-3 hours)
 - Written curriculum for multi-session course (8-24 or more hours)
 - Video recording or an NWMAF-approved observer's report of a short workshop or introductory session of a multi-session course.
 - References: Completed reference forms from three individuals with first-hand knowledge of your teaching and/or training. The link is on the Instructor Certification page.
 - Signing the ESD Code of Ethics. The link is on the Instructor Certification page
- Application Fee: \$125.00 (US funds). Link is on the Instructor Certification page. The fee may be negotiable. Contact <u>certification@nwmaf.org</u>.

The Review Process

- The Certification Coordinator will recruit two certified NWMAF ESD instructors to review the application materials. The reviewers will develop a timeline for the review and will communicate that timeline to the applicant.
- 2. Once the initial review is complete, the reviewers may request a follow-up meeting with the applicant to discuss the application.
- 3. Reviewers may request additional information and/or suggest additional training or preparation before recommending certification.
- 4. The applicant will receive written feedback from the reviewers.
- 5. When the certification decision is made, applicants are notified immediately. Formal awards of certification are made at the next annual conference.

- Describe your experience in teaching students who are different from you in terms of age, ability/disability, gender identity, national origin, race/ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, social class, etc.
- Describe lessons you have learned from working with students whose experience of violence is different from your own and what you have done to make your teaching relevant to them.

- Creating physical and emotional safety for students, staff, and community partners (e.g.sexual harassment, sexual or intimate relationships, consent for touch).
- Maintaining financial integrity (e.g. making programs financially accessible, handling refunds and cancellations, and paying instructors).
- Creating accessibility, inclusion, empowerment, and social justice (e.g. welcoming people who experience marginalization, inclusive language, accessible techniques, affirmation of human rights).
- Maintaining professional competence (e.g. continuing education, evidence-based teaching, conduct evaluations/research of your programs).
- Maintaining professional boundaries (e.g. have a support system other than your students, sharing personal information—yourself and students).

Evidence of ESD Curricula Development

Written curriculum for short workshop (1-3 hours)
Written curriculum for multi-session course (8-24 hours)

Format for submitted curricula:

- Use an outline format with clear time allocations given for each section
- Avoid jargon that your reviewer may not understand (i.e. the 1-2-3 drill)

- Indicate whether the type of activity, i.e. lecture, small group discussion, line drill, partner work, role play, etc.
- Include any additional instructor notes that support your outline.

Evidence of Teaching Ability

Observations of your teaching. Options include:

- Providing a video recording of one of your short workshop programs. This video will be viewed only by the reviewers and possibly by the Empowerment Self-Defense Certification Coordinator.
- Inviting one of the NWMAF Reviewers to observe or participate in one of your workshops in person
- Making it possible for one of the NWMAF Reviewers to observe your workshop remotely.
